The 3 R's

Need to cover those drain holes in pots for transplanting flowers or houseplants? Use dry fall leaves to layer in the bottom of the pots. They are strong/coarse enough to hold the soil and plants and yet will slowly decompose later. Use crunched, dry leaves to fill large planters half full to make lighter. Pack leaves tightly so soil won't sink too far down.

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY BEFORE DIGGING/POTTING PLANTS

All plants must be in containers. Pot plants as least 2-3 weeks before the sale so they will look good

Be generous with what you put in the pot. Plants that look healthy and full will sell better, especially if they are in bloom.

Healthy Houseplants/Herbs/Wildflowers will also be accepted.

If you don't have plants from your garden to donate, flowers or herbs can be donated.

Print the following information on a plant stake/label in BLACK/INDELIBLE INK:

Common name- Sun/Shade- Color- Height/Spread- Bloom time

Leave space for price---DO NOT PRICE

Appearance is very important—make sure the exterior of the pot is clean & presentable.

Bring plants to the Fitness Center on Friday, May 13 between 4pm & 7pm, or 7:30 to 8:30 am Saturday, May 14. Preference is for Friday night, as we need time to price and sort the plants.

If possible, bring wagons to transport plants to cars, plastic grocery bags, old towels, or old plant trays.

We need as many members as possible to help with the sale. The Garden Club is your club, and if everyone does a small part, the sale will be a great success! This is our biggest fundraiser, and is always a lot of fun!
