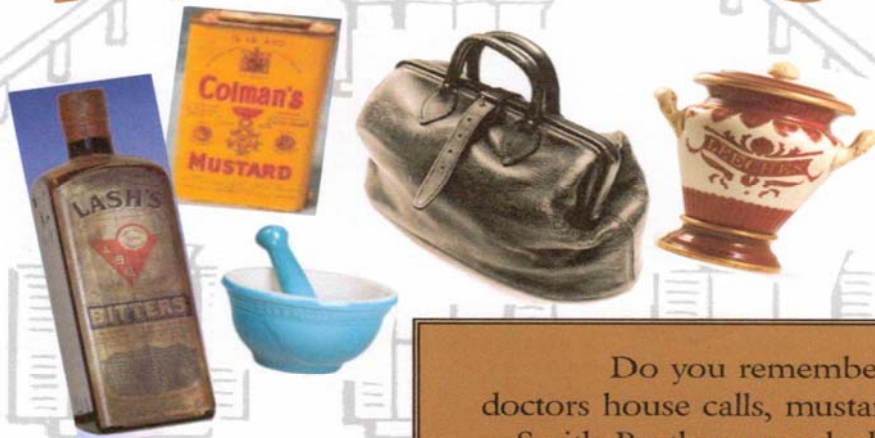

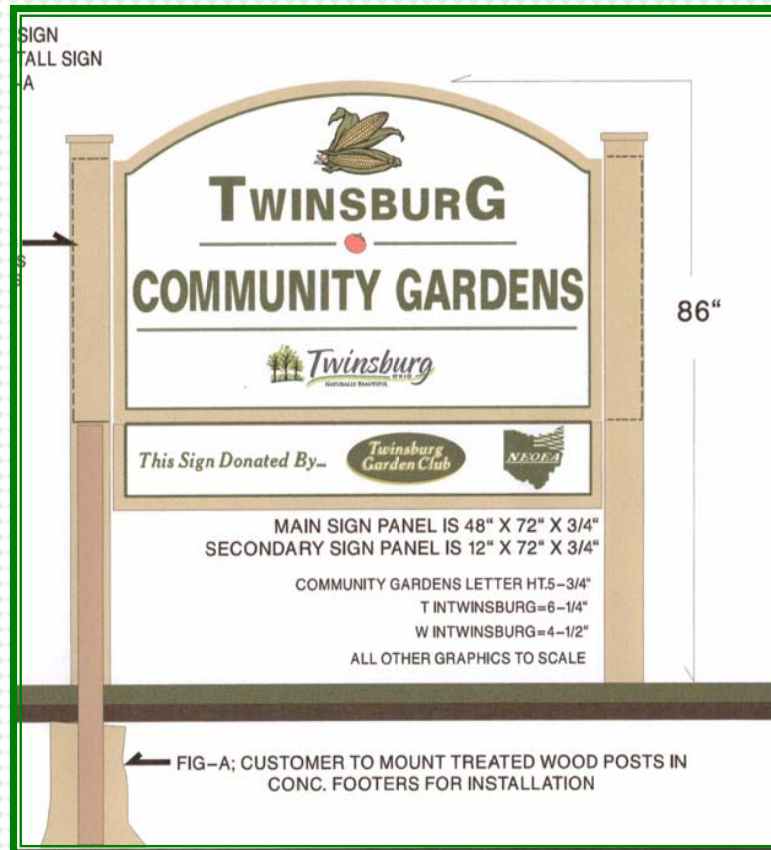
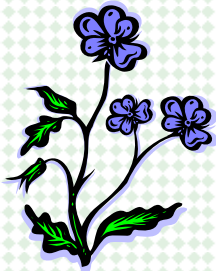

Standard Flower Show Basics

Each Division of a Flower Show is divided into Sections and each section into classes. Some sections may be eligible for awards in addition to ribbons.

Examples:

Division I – Horticulture

Eligible for Award of Merit

Section A – Annuals

Class 1 – Snapdragon – 1 stem

Class 2 – Petunia – 1 spray

Class 3 – Impatiens – 1 spray, etc.

Division II – Design

Eligible for Petite Award

Section A - Miniatures

Class 1 – Mini - 5” overall

Class 2 – Mini – 8” overall

Class 3 – Mini – 8” overall, etc.

The listing of all of the Rules, Divisions, Classes and Awards is known as “The Schedule”...most important to remember is:

“The Schedule is the Law”

The schedule will list the general rules for the flower show (date, times, locations), rules for the horticulture division and rules for the design division. It will list the scale of points that the judges use and define what is and what isn't allowed to be used.

Examples of Horticulture Rules:

All entries must be **fresh** plant material grown by the exhibitor.

Container-grown plants must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least 90 days.

All specimens must be labeled with the correct botanical name, genus and species, variety or cultivar, when applicable. The common name may be added.

An exhibitor may have more than one entry per class provided each is of a different genus, species, variety, cultivar type, form, size or color.

Examples of Design Rules:

All club members are expected to enter.

All classes require registration and if a designer is unable to honor her commitment then it is her responsibility to find a replacement.

An exhibitor may enter as many classes as desired but only one exhibit per class.

Some plant material must be used in every exhibit.
